

What Registered Voters Say ...



More than two-thirds (69%) of registered voters agree that Congress should consider legislation to reform pharmacy benefit managers' role and actions in healthcare to be "must-pass legislation" before concluding its work in 2024.



Nearly two-thirds (63%) say they would be more likely to vote for a candidate running for office in their Congressional District if they were to pass PBM reform legislation. More than two-thirds (69%) agree that their member of Congress should do whatever it takes to ensure Congress passes PBM reform legislation in 2024.

When thinking about the upcoming elections, **nearly** nine-in-ten say each of the following healthcare-related issues are important to their vote:

- Prescription drug prices (87%)
- Access to healthcare (88%)
- Affordability of healthcare (88%)
- Ability of patients to choose their healthcare providers (87%)



74% have a favorable opinion of pharmacies. 81% have a favorable opinion of their pharmacist.

This poll was conducted by Morning Consult and commissioned by NACDS between October 1-October 3, 2024, among a sample of 1,778 Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Registered Voters based on gender by age, educational attainment, race, marital status, home ownership, race by educational attainment, 2020 presidential vote, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
